Each year it is our privilege to recognize Career and Technical Education (CTE) teachers working behind the walls of Texas prisons. These men and women work daily in shops and classrooms across the state, presenting an opportunity for offenders to learn and grow. When offenders leave TDCJ, they must be able to successfully obtain jobs, remain employed, and avoid returning to prison. CTE training is a critical part of this process, with students learning occupational skills to entry level industry standards and earning industry certification.

Windham CTE instructors are certified by the Texas Education Agency, hold appropriate industry certification for their trades, and remain some of the most highly certified vocational instructors in Texas. Last school year, Windham CTE teachers in 34 vocational trade areas provided training for 11,290 offenders. WSD offers diversified fields of study for a diversified population, including automotive specialization, landscaping, business computer systems, construction carpentry, plant maintenance, and many others.

Windham CTE instructors and their colleagues, college vocational instructors also working in TDCJ, are recognized for their valuable contribution. Despite the challenges and restrictions of the prison environment, these educators are helping build a better Texas. We thank them for all they do!
